DIRECTOR'S NOTE

Kirsten Greenidge's 2016 play *Baltimore* revolves around a racist incident perpetrated in a first-year dorm at a northeast college. It's important to remember the time in which this was written and when the play is set. In the Fall of 2016, President Barack Obama was still in the White House trying to get the Senate to confirm Merrick Garland for the Supreme Court. Britain had decided to leave the European Union. Russia was playing havoc with our electoral system. We were all still reeling from the Pulse Club shooting in Orlando. And despite the miracles of the Cleveland Cavaliers and Chicago Cubs winning world championships, hope and change curdled into fear and loathing with alarming speed.

It's important to remember how quickly things can seemingly turn when we engage in the conversations we need to have. We know that an alarming number of conversations happened among people all over the world who have somehow found themselves supporting authoritarian governments, morally challenged leaders and unwise (please note the understatement here) wars. And yet those conversations are decades, even centuries old. The arc of the moral universe might be long, but it won't bend toward justice without us engaged in the same conversations.

I think Greenidge is holding us accountable in asking, demanding us to breathe in the conflicts, the joy, the confusions, the emotional arias of this play. The students in this play have demonstrated so much courage in embodying the message of this play for the Trinity community specifically and Hartford generally. Every day they say things on that stage (or hear things) that repulse them, trigger them, inspire them, or define them. Each of these things take enormous psychic and spiritual energy to hold and unleash in a theatre full of their peers, their elders, and strangers. Together, well ... it's a lot of things.

I invite you to experience this show through the lens of gratitude, active listening, joy, and, most of all, fearlessness. I believe that is the least we can do to honor the work of the cast and crew of Baltimore.
