Channon S. Miller, PhD, Hartford-raised, is an interdisciplinary Americanist and Historian of Black women's interior and exterior lives. Dr. Miller excavates stories about Black motherhood and Black diaspora from geographies often marginalized. Hartford and the lives and activism of its Black communities since the mid-twentieth century, mass migration of Black people there from the South as well as the Caribbean – grounds and inspires her research. She invites students to explore the Black past and present by hearing and dialoguing with the voices and productions of Black peoples themselves.

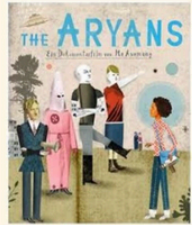

Mo Asumang, Germany's first Afro-German TV presenter and moderator, as well as documentary filmmaker and activist, will be visiting Trinity College on September 15-16. Mo Asumang is widely renowned for her documentary film *The Aryans* (2014) in which she explores the topics of racism and hatred among various rightwing, white supremacist groups in Germany and the United States. More recently, Mo Asumang has become active as a specialist in creating dialogues with people who think differently, which she has developed into a workshop model that she has given on antiracism in businesses, schools, and universities.



Domestic Violence Awareness Month

“Domestic violence (also called intimate partner violence, domestic abuse, or relationship abuse) is a pattern of behaviors used by one partner to maintain power and control over another partner in an intimate relationship.”

“Domestic violence includes behaviors that physically harm, cause fear, prevent a partner from doing what they wish, or force them to behave in ways they do not want.”
In a dating or hook-up situation the same can occur.

“NEARLY 3 IN 10 WOMEN (29%) AND 1 IN 10 MEN (10%) IN THE US HAVE EXPERIENCED RAPE, PHYSICAL VIOLENCE, AND/OR STALKING BY A PARTNER AND REPORTED IT HAVING A RELATED IMPACT ON THEIR FUNCTIONING.”

“INTIMATE PARTNER VIOLENCE ALONE AFFECTS MORE THAN 12 MILLION PEOPLE EVERY YEAR.”

“AN AVERAGE OF 24 PEOPLE PER MINUTE ARE VICTIMS OF RAPE, PHYSICAL VIOLENCE OR STALKING BY AN INTIMATE PARTNER IN THE UNITED STATES”

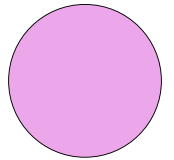

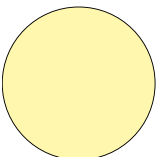
